- Bioanthropology and Museums: documentation and issues of inventorying and affiliating culturally unidentifiable human remains



12:15PM	 ♠ Research and Community Interests (3 groups) Explore ways in which researchers and museums can better speak to the needs of communities - what information is provided to communities, what research questions are being asked? What do communities want/need to know about human remains in museum collections? ♦ Standards of Care for Human Remains Develop realistic and sustainably shared standards that reflect needs of all stakeholders, intentionally including requests for guidance on aspects of care from descendent communities, ethical considerations during necessary handling or survey, and guidelines for visiting researchers to ensure maintenance of museum standards during research visits. Discuss challenges specific to the curation of human remains, and bring plans and images of various storage solutions to share. ♦ Standards of Recording and Documentation Consider the recurring challenges of osteological recording, such as individuating and determining MNI with commingled remains. Review preferred methods of documentation and recording of human remains in various states of preservation. Feel free to bring examples of preferred documentation methods to share. How should culturally unidentified human remains be documented?

Collaborative Research Projects (2 groups)

Consider how to best move forward to facilitate sustainable collaborative projects involving human remains collections; share examples of past projects, and analyze what did or did not work to help reflect on past projects as guidance for future collaborations.

♦ Managing Non-NAGPRA Human Remains

Discuss collections that do not fall under the purview of NAGPRA, including Canadian collections and non-native North American collections. Consider differences and similarities between non-NAGPRA Canadian and U.S. human remains practices

♦ Considerations of Spirituality, Safety, and Comfort

Explore spiritual care of human remains in collections and staff/visitors involved with those collections. Discuss ways to provide comfort and spiritual safety for both staff and visitors interacting and working with human remains.

Managing Collections Access

What information is most useful/needed for dissemination? Focusing on culturally unidentified human remains, assess methods of providing access for research, specifically focused on invasive vs. non-invasive research. How to address issues of access and dissemination in relation to the creation of a IMLS portal for this symposium - how should access to varying types of information be determined and restricted?

Assess methods of providing access for researchers, specifically focused on invasive vs. non-invasive research (focusing on culturally unidentified remains). What questions can be addressed by specific research approaches? Consider the implications of collections digitization and reproduction (CT imaging, 3D printing, etc.). Examine "pros and cons" of increased digital access to collections in light of privacy concerns.

Research dissemination and future initiatives

Consider ways to facilitate sustainable collaborative projects between researchers and communities. What types of information are most useful/needed for dissemination?

Fostering communication between communities and institutions

Discuss best ways to communicate/disseminate between communities, researchers, and museums. Where are there problems with the flow of communication and how can those issues be addressed? Consider methods of information sharing, including information regarding unaffiliated (or CUI) remains.

♦ Methods and future steps in cultural affiliation determination (2 groups)

Discuss the documentation process of human remains, and the challenges of determining affiliation for unaffiliated human remains. Consider situations of ancestral descendant linkages and multiple descendant claims
